Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It's hard to believe that it is just over one year since the novel Covid virus had spread and our lives changed. We found ourselves in the midst of a pandemic. Our lives were disrupted while working to fatten the curve of its spread. To do this we had to learn to do many things differently. I was reminded this week of all the resources we have at our disposal today that were not available in the pandemic of 1918-1920.

With vaccinations and caution in what we do and how we meet, there is hope that we will be back to normal by the end of the year. But what will that normal look like. Many of the ways we have learned to do things we will continue to do, some we won't.

As we come to the last week of Lent, Holy Week, I can't help but think about how the lives of those who followed Jesus were about to change. Of course, we know what happened that week as we prepare for Easter to come.

We tend to treat Easter as a one-off or one day event, the calumniation of Lent. But in reality, it is a beginning. It is the first day of Eastertide. The resurrection wasn't the end of the story. Things changed and Jesus' followers had to learn how to do things with the change. Some things they would try and fail at but they would learn. In the last line of the hymn, *We Are the Church* it says that we are the church and the church is always learning. We have been learning since the beginning and we are still learning.

As has been happening the past year, things will be different this Holy Week. Two of the churches in this charge have started holding in-person worship services but there will not be mid-week services. As with the rest of Lent, alternative ways needed to be considered for mid-week services, Maunday Thursday (Holy Thursday) and Good Friday. Please see the devotional included to help you observe these two days.

It is an exciting time of the year filled with anticipation. Anticipation of the resurrection, new growth with spring, and wondering what things will be like in a new since of normalcy.

Holy Week

March 28-April 3, 2021

Maunday Thursday (April 1st)

The Maundy part of Maunday Thursday comes from the Latin word mandatum, which means "command or order." Mandatum is also the source of the word mandate.

Maunday Thursday is so named from words spoken by Jesus to his disciples after he washed their feet while joining in the Last Supper: "I give you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you also must love each other," (John 13:34) He continues: "This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other." (John 13:35)

Traditionally two things happen this evening. Some churches gather to wash feet as Jesus had done. Many more gather together to remember this last supper by taking Communion. Because we will not meet for in-person worship this evening, two ways have been planned to be in community and partake in Communion.

1. On Palm/Passion Sunday pick up blessed pre-filled communion cups for each person in your household who will participate. There will also be a slip of paper with words to use on Maunday Thursday. At 7:00pm on Thursday, April 1st read the words and eat and drink the elements, remembering that others will be doing this at the same time.

2. Between 6:00-7:00 at Boyceville UMC there will be drive through Communion available. Drive through under the car port and Pastor Shannon will be there with the pre-filled communion cups.

Good Friday (April 2nd)

Why would we call a day to remember Jesus' death on a cross good? There are many words that we use contractions for today. Some of our everyday words developed over time from contractions. It is thought that good developed from a contraction of the Germanic word meaning God's or Holy. In most languages it would be translated as Holy Friday or God's Friday.

Traditionally people gather Good Friday to remember Jesus' betrayal, and death on the cross. We ponder what it all means, remembering that, while we look forward to the resurrection celebrated on Easter, those who watched Jesus die and his body placed in the tomb had no knowledge or understanding of what was to happen even though he had tried to tell them.

On this Good Friday, take some time to read John 18:1-19:42. Ponder what Jesus does and says as he is condemned and hung on the cross.

Included here is a square of paper infused with wildflower seeds and a cross drawn on it. In John 12: 24 Jesus said, "I assure you that unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it can only be a single seed. But if it dies, it bears much fruit."

Place this piece of paper under some soil in a pot, water it, and watch for what grows from the seeds. Just as Jesus' mother, disciples, and friends did not know what would come from his death, we do not know what grows from these seeds will look like. As you watch them sprout and grow over the next few weeks of Eastertide, ponder what has happened, grown from Jesus' death and resurrection.
