
Sermon by Phone

2023 Ingathering for Annual Conference

This year the Boyceville mission team has set an ambitious goal of putting together 50 Personal Dignity Kits! Last year our three churches put together 26 Personal Dignity Kits. Midwest Missions is in great need of these kits, they are currently shipping them to Turkey and Ukraine. The Personal Dignity Kit is the kit they give out the most of. The second most needed kit is the Home Care Kit. We have a few 5 gallon buckets with lids at Boyceville, just waiting to be filled. The list of needed items for the two kits is listed below. Even single items for kits are welcome. All items need to be to Boyceville by Sunday June 4th. UMCOR has also sent out a list of some urgently needed items as well. Don't want to shop, cash donations are welcome too. The noisy can will be making the rounds at Boyceville. That list is found below too. Working together we can bring a message of hope and love to our brothers and sisters around the world.

Urgent Needs

- Shampoo (in bulk) 12-19 oz
- 100-150 oz EMPTY Liquid Laundry Detergent Containers. We can use containers of any sdize up to 150 oz. We are collecting full or empty liquid laundry detergent containers.
- Sewing Machines, electric or treadle (They don't have to be new. We cannot accept computerized machines)
- Medical Equipment folding walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, canes, walking boots, slings
- Blankets new or gently used
- Non-electric Tools (shovels, brooms,

Personal Dignity Kit

- 1 Bath Hand Towel—no kitchen towels
- 1 Bath Washcloth—no kitchen towels
- 1 Adult Toothbrush—no need to buy these we have over 100 on hand
- 1 Bar Soap 3-4 oz
- 1 Shampoo 15-18 oz
- 1 Deodorant 2-3 0z stick, roll-on or spray

Place items in a 1 gallon resealable plastic bag with \$2 for toothpaste and a razor

Home Care Kit

- 2 Liquid Household Cleaners 16-40 oz No Spray Bottles
- 2 Dish Soaps 16-34 oz
- 2 Liquid Laundry Detergents 32-64 oz
- 1 Scrub Brush with or without handle
- 1 5 gallon Pail with lid—we have a few at Boyceville



Stewardship of Creation April 2023

Often, when the word "stewardship" is uttered in the church, we think of money, giving, and budgets. With the celebration of Earth Day, April is one of many occasions when we can remind ourselves that Christian stewardship is broader than just money. Here are just a few teachings on creation that have been passed on through the ages.

"The initial step for a soul to come to knowledge of God is contemplation of nature." – Irenaeus (120-202)

"Nature is schoolmistress, the soul the pupil; and whatever one has taught or the other has learned has come from God – the Teacher of the teacher." – Tertullian (160-230)

"Christ wears 'two shoes' in the world: Scripture and nature. Both are necessary to understand the Lord, and at no stage can creation be seen as a separation of things from God." – John Scotus Eriugena (810-877)

"If I spend enough time with the tiniest of creature – even a caterpillar – I would never have to prepare a sermon. So full of God is every creature." – Meister Eckhart (1260-1327)

"God writes the Gospel not in the Bible alone, but also on trees, and in the flowers and clouds and stars." – Martin Luther (1483-1546)

"Let everyone regard himself as the steward of God in all things which he possesses. Then he will neither conduct himself dissolutely, nor corrupt by abuse those things which God requires to be preserved." - John Calvin (1509-1564)

"I believe in my heart that faith in Jesus Christ can and will lead us beyond an exclusive concern for the well-being of other human beings to the broader concern for the well-being of the birds in our backyards, the fish in our rivers, and every living creature on the face of the earth." – John Wesley (1701- 1791)
