

Dear Friends,

As we continue our Lenten journey, I'd like to spur you on in your reading of the book of Psalms. The Psalms are rightfully described as the Hymnbook of the Hebrew People, and they offer us a powerful guide for reflection, prayer, and spiritual growth.

In the Psalms, we find profound metaphors and words that often mirror our own spiritual lives. Here we find worry, lament, repentance-- frequently turning to hope and praise. God inspired and preserved these prayers and songs so that we, too, could grow in our faith.

We began Lent on Ash Wednesday with Psalm 51, the traditional Psalm of repentance. The themes of God's care and protection shine through in Psalms 27 and 91. And Psalm 63 speaks of a deep and trusting relationship with God.

These Psalms aren't just ancient words on a page; they are invitations to invigorate our prayers.

In this time of spiritual preparation let us take our time with the Psalms and reflect on a verse or two that genuinely speaks to us.

This Lent, may these Psalms help us find our peace in God's presence. And as we continue our journey toward Easter, may we be reminded of God's steadfast love.

O give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever. Psalm 136:1

In addition to hearing about her work internationally, we'll also get to try our hand at a mission project we can do locally: using plastic shopping bags to weave sleeping mats



for people who are homeless. The sleeping mats project will continue throughout the summer, but April 6 will be a great opportunity to learn how it is done so we can keep the progress going when the looms travel to each of our churches in the months ahead.

Donations of Plastic Shopping Bags Needed

Most Midwesterners have a "bag of bags" tucked somewhere in their homes, collecting those plastic shopping bags from our groceries or other purchases. If your bag of bags is getting a little bulky, would you consider donating some excess bags to our circuit?


One of the mission projects we hope to take on this summer is weaving sleeping mats out of plastic shopping bags for experiencing people homelessness. During our next circuit-wide meeting on Sunday, April 6 at 1:30 pm at Trinity United Methodist Church in Elk Mound. we'll have a practice session where we'll learn the process for weaving those mats. Then throughout the next several months, the four looms we have in our circuit will travel from church to church so that each congregation can help complete as many mats as possible. It takes at least 500 bags to complete one sleeping mat, so we'll need LOTS of bags. Ask your pastor where bags can be collected at your church.

Mission Project for Boyceville -Birthing Kit

Here is our project for the Annual Conference Ingathering in June. Last year Midwest Mission did a review of the Birthing Kit. They talked with midwives and doctors that use the kits to find out just what they needed. During this time they stopped collecting the kits. The new flyer for this year's Midwest Mission projects has the following banner: "Birthing Kit, it's back and better!" We will be collecting items and full kits during April and May. Don't want to shop, cash donations are welcome.

Supplies for the Birthing Kit

- 1 bar of soap 3-4oz.
- 1 hand towel (no kitchen towels).
- 1 wash cloth (no dishcloths).
- 2 receiving blankets 28" x 28" to 32" x
- 32" (no fleece or thermal blankets).
- 1 gallon resealable bag
- \$3 donation for umbilical cord clamps, sterile surgical gloves, and scalpel.

Place all the items in the bag.

We are also collecting plastic grocery bags to make mats
